

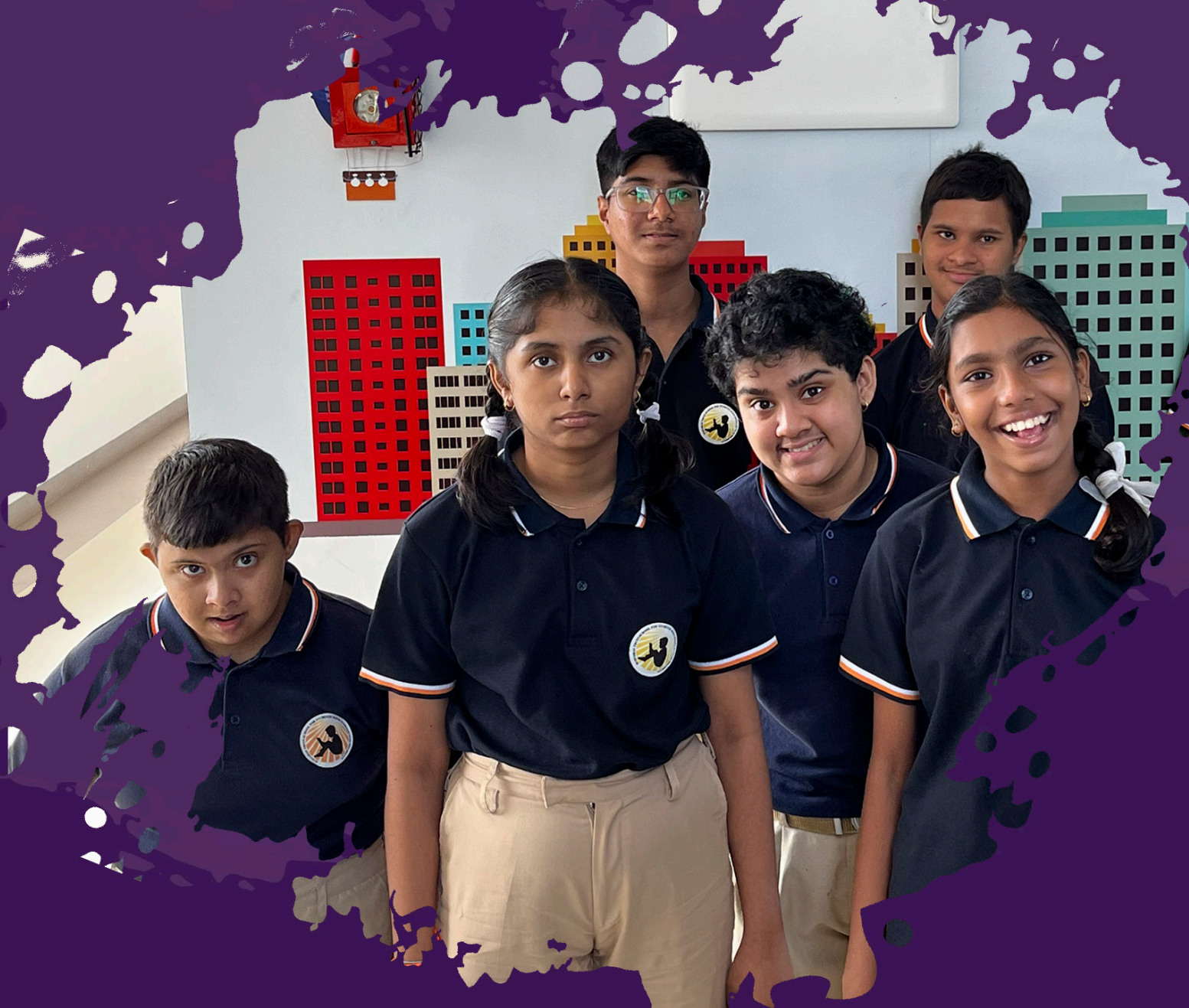

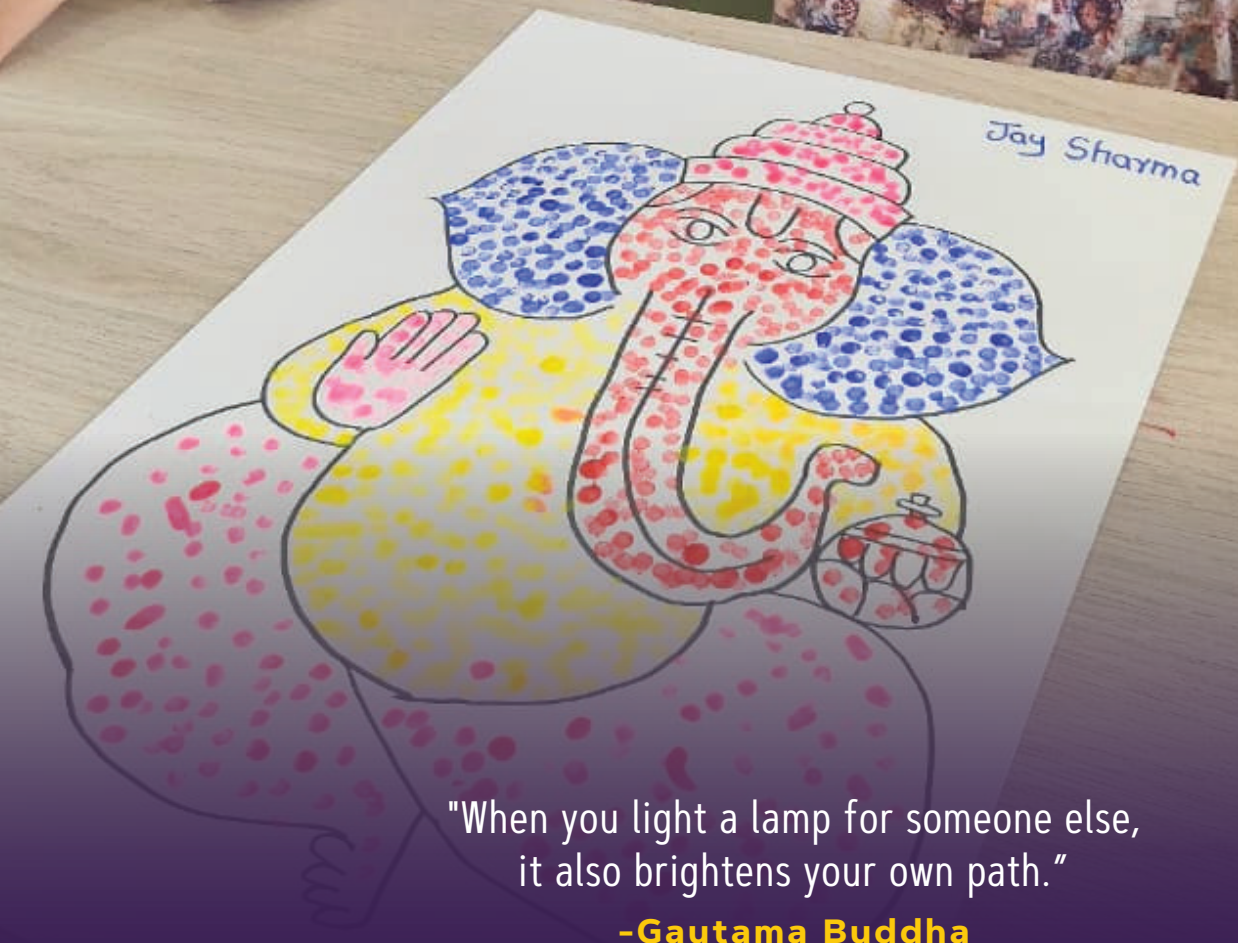

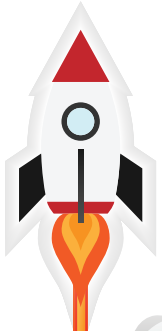

- New school building approvals and plans completed

- School building construction completed and all children shifted to the new school premises in April 2024.
- Launched Project Pragati – a Vocational Training and Skill Development Centre at Bhayander.
- Launched Project Lakshya – Digital IEP initiative in collaboration with NIEPID.
- Enabled employment opportunities for 5 students in 2024.

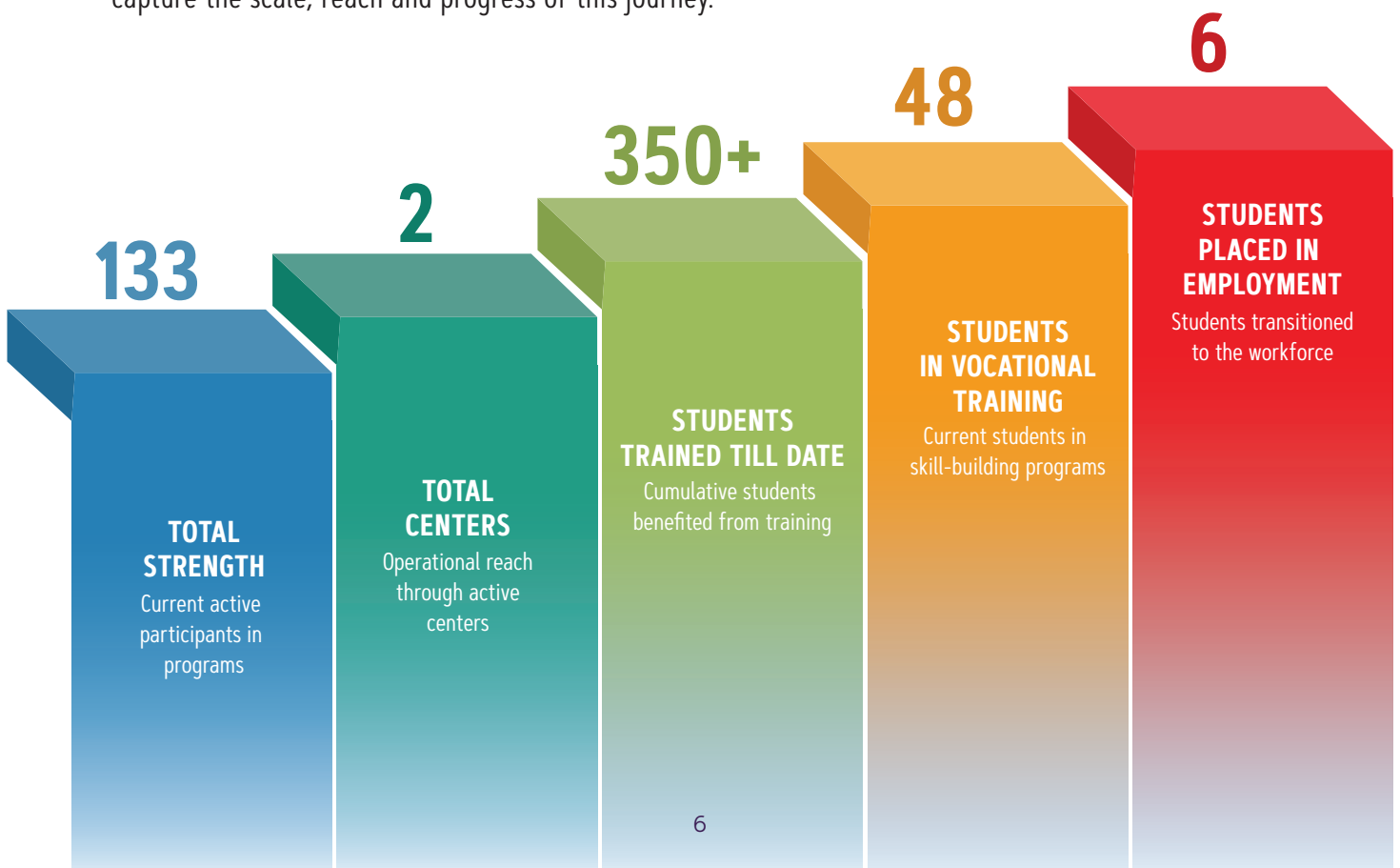


# OUR IMPACT JOURNEY

For 15 years, Suryoday Trust has empowered children and young adults with intellectual disabilities through education, therapy, life-skills and vocational training. Our work supports inclusion, well-being and self-reliance, while contributing to relevant SDGs. The outcomes and impact metrics presented here capture the scale, reach and progress of this journey.



## 2024-25 : THE YEAR OF POWER

The year 2024-25 will be remembered as a truly transformative period for Suryoday Trust, a year that reflected the spirit of POWER: Purpose. Opportunity. Will. Empowerment. Resilience.

Each of these values came alive through the work we strengthened, the milestones we achieved, and the lives we touched across our school and vocational programs.

**Purpose:** This year, we revisited our foundational vision and aligned our interventions more closely with the needs of our students and their families. Our teams reviewed learning outcomes, restructured developmental goals and ensured that every activity whether in classrooms, therapy rooms, or skill workshops contributed toward holistic growth. We strengthened the connection between education, therapy, life-skills and vocational readiness, ensuring that each student progresses at their own pace, with the right support systems in place.

**Opportunity:** Through Project Pragati our young adults received hands-on training. We focused on preparing them for real-life situations through structured exposure visits and practical learning experiences. They were trained in day-to-day functional skills such as reading MRP, understanding currency, filling cheques, maintaining basic records, and learning the fundamentals of independent living.

Under Project Unnati, several young adults successfully transitioned into full-time employment. The products made by the young adults were sold in B2B spaces Corporate exhibitions. All the sales proceeds received from this event are given to the young adults as a source of sustainable livelihood income.



**Will:** Every milestone achieved in 2024–25 was made possible by the collective will of our students, educators, therapists, families, trustees, donors and well-wishers. The determination we witnessed children learning new skills, young adults stepping into work environments and parents staying committed to their child’s progress—was deeply inspiring.

Our staff continued to go beyond routine teaching methods, innovating classroom strategies and therapy approaches to meet each learner’s needs. Recognising that quality outcomes depend on strong teams, the Trust also invested in staff development programs—ensuring that our educators and therapists remain trained, motivated, and equipped with modern practices.

**Empowerment:** Empowerment was the most visible outcome of our year seen in the growing confidence, independence and progress of our children and young adults. Through structured therapies such as occupational therapy, speech and language support, sensory integration and behavioural interventions, students strengthened essential life skills and functional abilities. Empowerment also came through skill development, sports and co-curricular activities, helping students build discipline, self-esteem, teamwork and readiness for independent living.

**Resilience:** A major milestone that symbolised our resilience was the completion of the new school building expansion project, a fire compliant, integrated structure connected to our existing facilities. This infrastructure development stands as a testament to our long-term vision, creating safe, accessible and future-ready spaces that support growth, inclusion and dignity for every learner.

This year reflected meaningful progress across Suryoday Trust’s core areas—education, skill-building, livelihood and digital inclusion—guided by our philosophy of Potential, Opportunity and Empowerment.

## Suryoday RBL School - Inclusive Education

- Sports and cultural events built confidence and social skills.

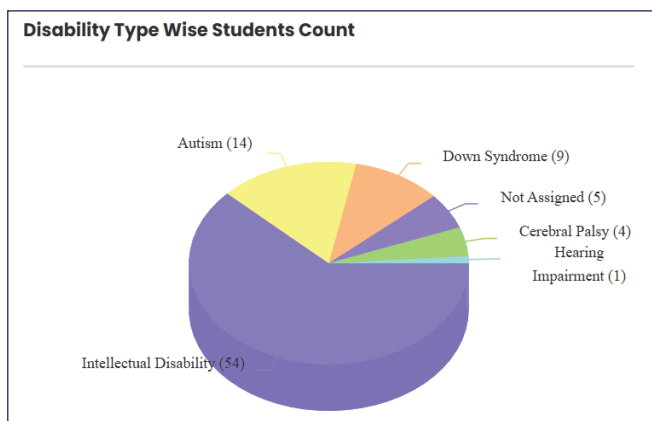

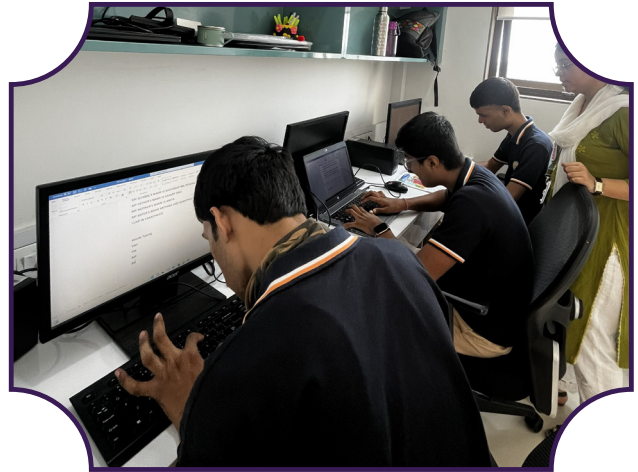
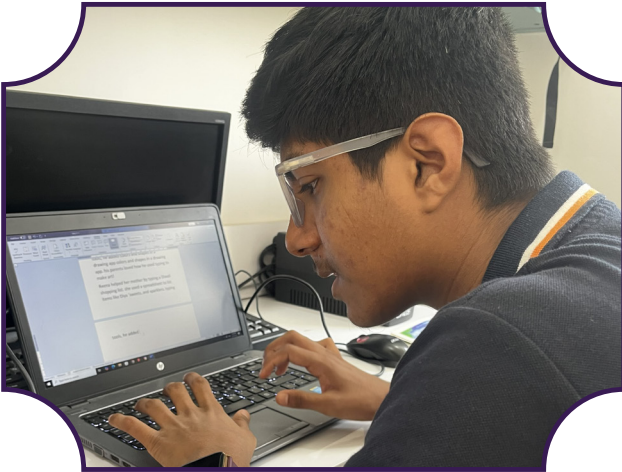

**Jay Sharma - Little Moons**  
(Early Intervention Class)

Jay Sharma, a 6-year-old student of Little Moon class with mild intellectual disability, began his educational journey with challenges in attention, following instructions, and speaking in full sentences. Over time, he has made significant progress. He can now follow one- to two-step commands, shows better memory, attention, and concentration, and has improved in emotional expression and participation in group activities. His language and communication skills have developed notably, supporting his academic growth. Jay's fine and gross motor skills, including pre-writing and in-hand manipulation, have improved, enhancing his classroom performance. He has also integrated well with peers, forming friendships and a sense of belonging. His progress reflects resilience and the effectiveness of holistic, tailored educational strategies.



**Laiba Shah-Artful Stitchwork**  
(Primary Class)

Laiba Shah, a student in the Artful Stitchwork Class with Mild Intellectual Disability began her journey with challenges in speech, learning, social interaction and anger management. Through consistent support and targeted interventions, she has shown remarkable progress. Laiba now follows instructions better, communicates more confidently, expresses her emotions appropriately and demonstrates improved academic and fine motor skills. She has also built meaningful peer relationships and manages her emotions more effectively reflecting her resilience and the success of individualized educational support.

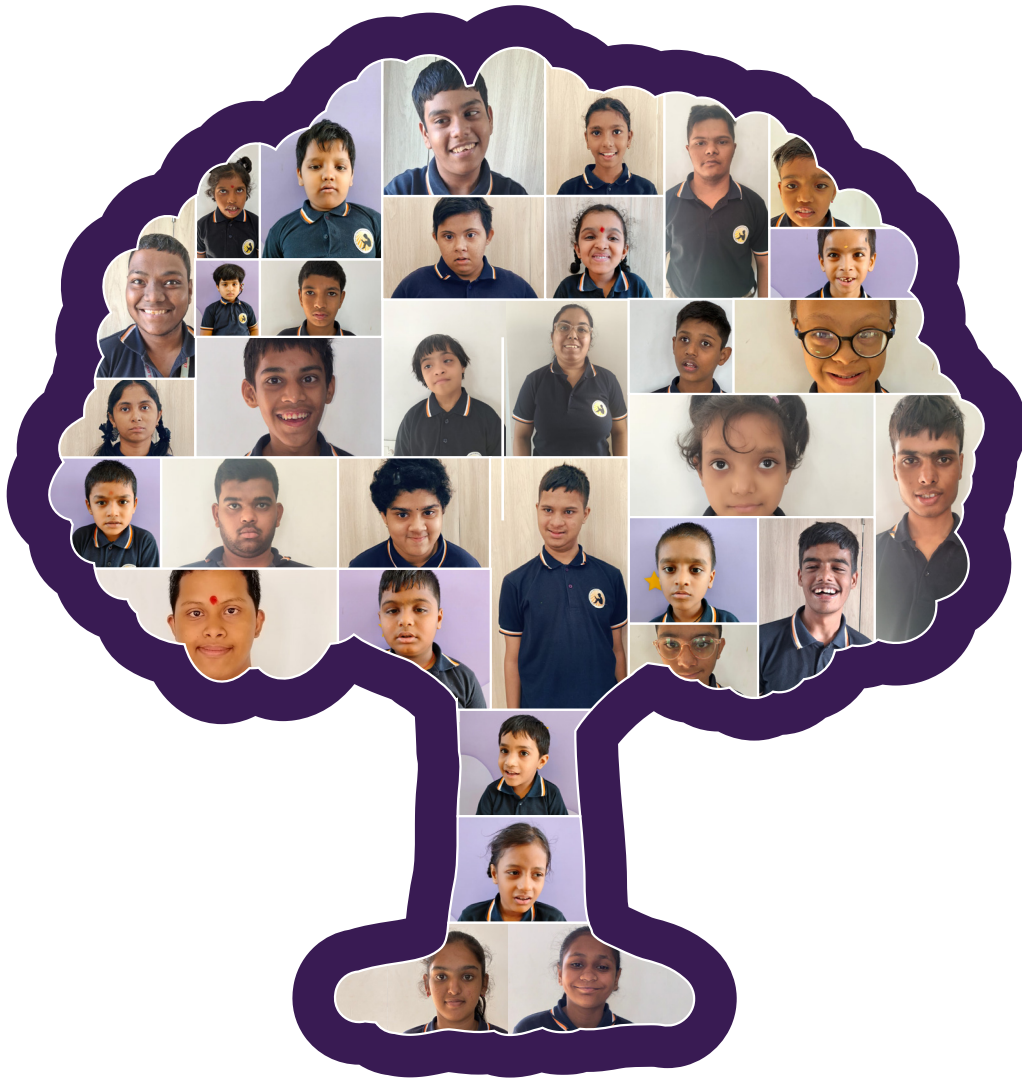
